
Main events from Dec. 2019 – Jan. 2020

Immersion Program Scientific Explorations of Chemistry, Food and Cosmetics (Indonesia)



From Jan. 7th ~ Jan. 16th, a 10-day immersion program was held by Department of Applied Chemistry, Department of Cosmetic Science and Department of Food and Nutrition. There are total of 29 participants (including students and teachers) from Mulawarman University, Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS), Atma Jaya University and Soegijapranata Catholic University.
